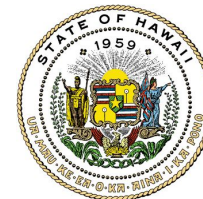
Food Pantries

- Shelf stable (canned goods)
- Dry (cereal, saimin, crackers, drinks, etc. – when available)
- Refrigerated (milk, eggs, produce, etc. – when available)
- Frozen (meats, meals, snacks, etc. – when available)
- Hygiene Products (when available)



The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) & State Emergency Food Assistance Program (SEFAP)

- Are residents of the City and County of Honolulu;
- Are lawfully present in the United States, but need not be citizens of the United States; and
- Were adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic;
- Must not exceed 185% of the Poverty Level
 - One person household – no more than \$28,915.50
 - Two person household – no more than \$38,961.00 annually





Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)



- Household income cannot exceed 300% of the 2022 Federal Poverty Level.
 - Two person household – no more than \$5,265 monthly
– no more than \$63,180.00 annually
- A family has at least 1 child under the age of 18 years old living in the household.
- One adult in the household must be a parent or relative of the child through blood or marriage.
- ALL members of the household must be a U.S. citizen.

Ohana Produce Plus Program

- Agency partners distribute to 100-300 households each distribution and provide fresh produce, assorted dry goods, and nonperishable items to underserved communities
- ~ 46 Locations
- ~ 15 distributions per week
- ~ 60 distributions per month

Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP)

- At least 60 years or older
- Resident of the county you reside in
- At or below 185% of the poverty guidelines
 - 1 person - \$31,025
 - 2 person - \$41,958





Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

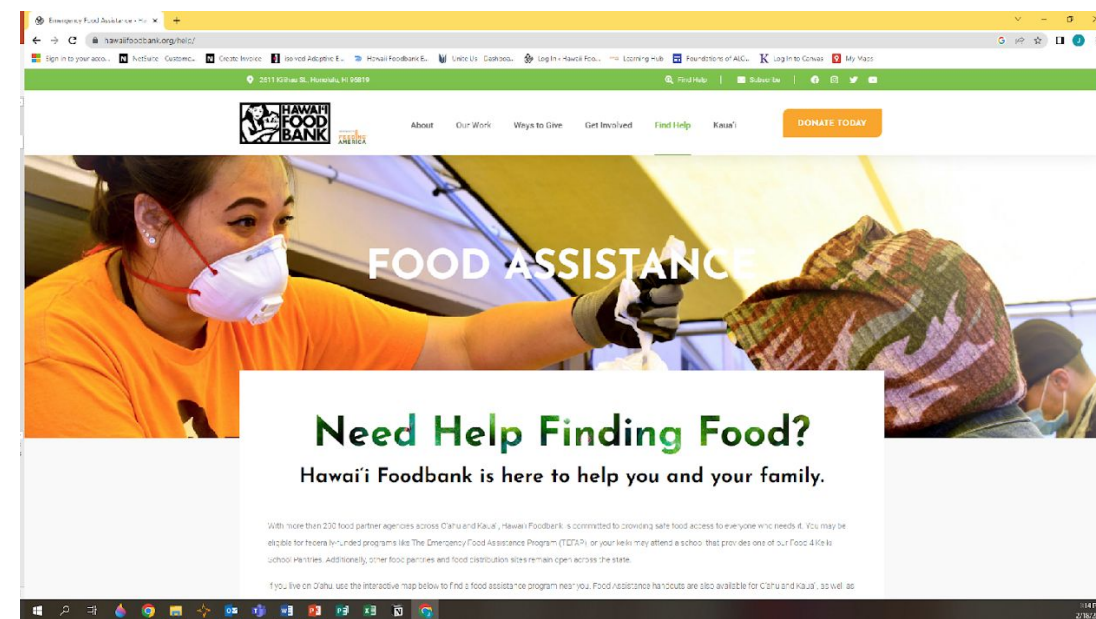
- 60 years or older
- Residents of Oahu & Kauai – This program operates on two islands
- Valid photo identification
- At or below 130% of the poverty guidelines (see household table on application)
 - 1 person - \$23,673 annually
 - 2 person - \$32,032 annually

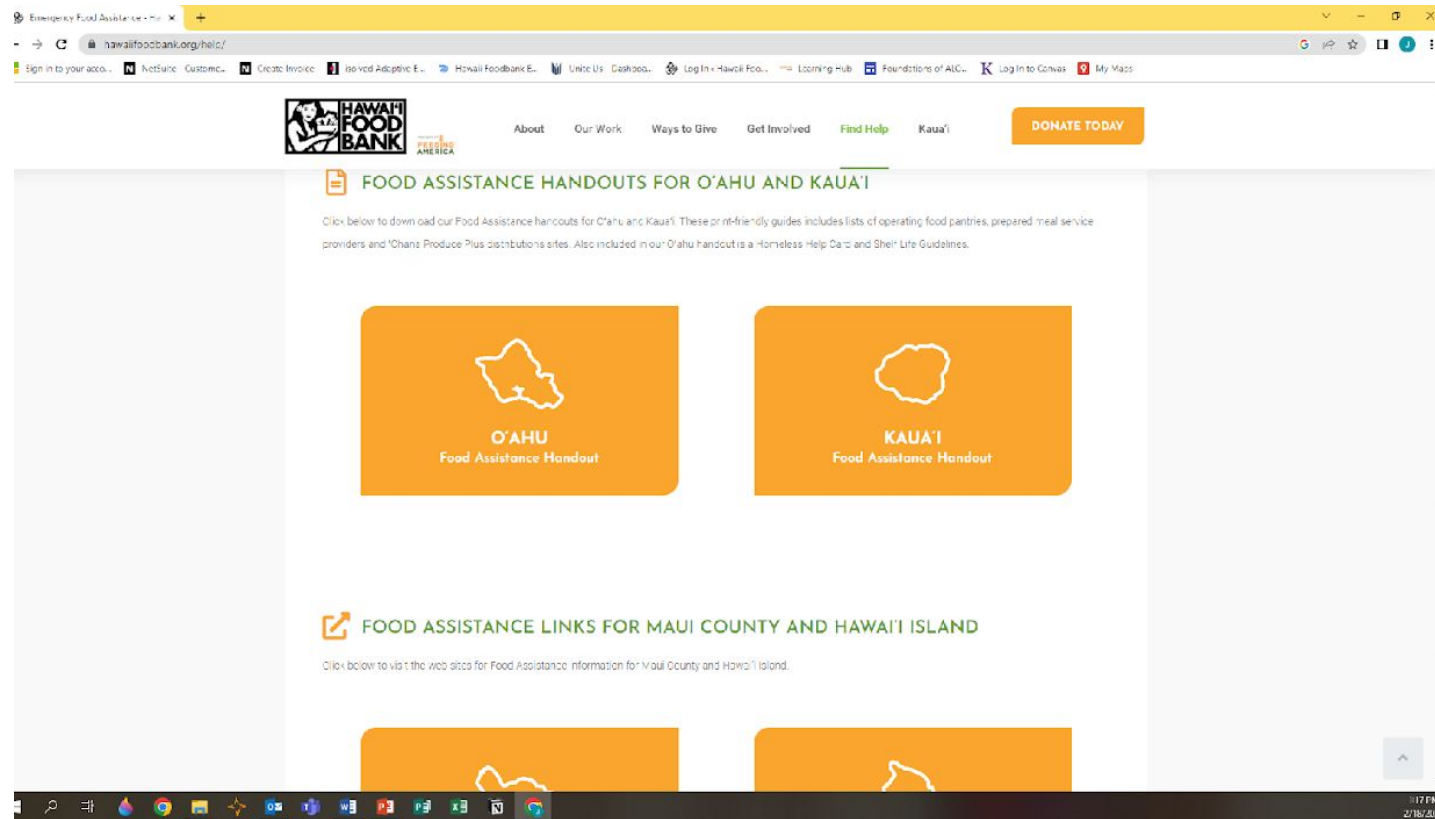

- **# of adults** in your household?
- **# of children** in your household?
- Is anyone in your household **employed**? Yes or No
- Is anyone in your household **receiving government assistance** (EBT, Quest, Section 8, Disability)? Yes or No
- Are you or anyone in your household currently in or has been in the **armed services**? Active, Veteran or No
